We offer three approaches to solve the immediate and long-term needs for teens currently in and aging out of foster care.



Immediate Placement

Removing the trauma while waiting for permanent placement.





Group Living

Long-term placement due to a shortage of foster homes willing to accept teens.





Independent Living

Wrap around support, housing placement, professional leadership and family support foundation.



Challenges:

Instability and inconsistency impacts both youth and social workers. Without our help, the trauma of these unstable environments have been shown to have a negative impact on youths for the rest of their lives. Multiple placements have also been found to lead to delayed permanency outcomes, academic difficulties, and struggles to develop meaningful attachments.
